

Using packaging card from the pantry

This retro telephone table is made by laminating layers of card together to create strong pieces to work with .

You will need a good glue. A shape blade or a Cricut machine. Some material for upholstering. Black paint.

1. Cut out the shapes on page 2. You can do this using a blade or downloading the page as a JPEG to use on your Cricut machine. Glue 3 seat pieces together and use the fourth to glue your upholstery around.
2. Upholster the seat and back pieces of card with material of your choice. Use a thin piece of foam if wanted.
3. Paint the legs and back rest support
4. Glue the back rest and support to side of seat. At same time glue one of the long angled legs on. It is easier to do this now.
5. Gluing the remaining legs to the seat base. This can be tricky. Best to glue on V-shape legs. Let dry. Then glue the remaining long leg on. Glue the table piece on last.
6. Use a 3 mm piece of card and cut a piece of card for the table top. Paint this your colour of choice. Glue to long legs.
7. Now you are finished your telephone table.
